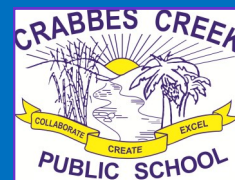


# Crabbes Creek Public School Newsletter

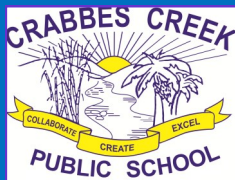

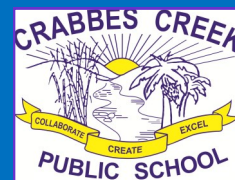
