Student - Drop off & Pick up - Thank you

All the staff would like to thank parents and carers for their patience and cooperation at drop off and pickup times, especially in regards to changed routines, that parents not being allowed on site has created. While the students are often tired or excited after a day of learning, the staff are committed to ensuring that every student is travelling home safely. The drop off and pickup times place children and vehicles in the same area, which creates risk and so there is a need to reduce it. To reduce risk, staff mark each student on the bus rolls, once they are sure they have each child, the group is then supervised as they walk through the car park and board the buses. Once the buses have left staff will begin to hand over supervision to those parents who are patiently queued in their vehicles or waiting nearby. We would also like to thank parents for notifying the school of changes to routine bus travel or pick up. The consistency of this, has not only reduced anxiety and confusion for our students at the end of the day but allowed staff to ensure they safely hand over supervision of every student, so they travel home safely. It has been an incredibly eventful year and the end of the school term is rapidly approaching. Like the rest of the year the 4 weeks are shaping up to be a busy time here at school. 
