Science Week

This week was national science week. The theme for this year's event was glass. On Monday, the students conducted a "glass" blowing experiment with honey. We watched a video of how glass is made. Following this students stirred honey at different temperatures representing how glass acts at different temperatures. Students also blew into the honey to see how hard it was to blow bubbles when it was cold. Next students placed a blob of honey on their straws and turned it like a glass blower.

On Wednesday morning the 3-6 class made teleidocopes. These are similar to kaleidoscope however they are open ended. The students had to work together to make their teleidoscope then explore how many shapes they could see with different objects in the classroom. We then also explored the garden and found when we zoom in and out of and object it makes a different pattern. The students really enjoyed the amazing patterns they created.

On Thursday, the students explored how glass is incorporated into electronic devices such as iPad. They then conducted an experiment using different types of martials including paper, cloth, fruit and vegetables to see if they would make the touch screen work. The students had fun predicting what would and wouldn't work. Miss Craig.
